With fire season over, now is the opportune time to get some projects done around the tree farm and property. Here are just a few things to think about completing this fall:

November

- ✓ Maintenance/Winterize Equipment
- ✓ Pruning:
 - Reduce ladder fuels
 - Improve aesthetics
 - Improve log quality
- ✓ Year-end Taxes

- ✓ Treat Slash Piles:
 - o Chip or burn
- ✓ Make any reforestation plans
- ✓ Check culverts and drainage systems

December

- ✓ Review 2021 accomplishments
- ✓ Refresh boundaries and signage
- ✓ Renew association memberships
- ✓ Complete 2021 record keeping

January

- ✓ Plan your 2022 projects:
 - Contact consultants
 - Hire contractors
 - File for necessary permits
- ✓ Frozen ground can be a good time for ground-based operations
- ✓ Update your management plan
- Monitor nesting and other wildlife activity so you can plan to protect/improve habitat and avoid disturbance
