

Happy Holidays from NEOSWA

We wanted to create a special holiday edition of *The Blue Mountain Forester* to say thank you and wish you all a Happy Holidays, and to reflect on what we have accomplished this year and look ahead for what's to come.



2021 - NEOSWA is Born

After a period of inactivity, the former Baker County Private Woodlands Association convened to restart and revitalize the Chapter, to provide a place for learning, engagement, and camaraderie for small woodland owners and those with a passion for forestry and natural resources. After electing a new Board, we began reviewing Bylaws and determining a vision for the Chapter. Following some discussion, and meetings with OSWA State leadership, we decided to structure the Chapter to include Baker, Grant, Union, and Wallowa Counties. Grant had traditionally been apart of the Baker Chapter since their Chapter's dissolution in 2011, but Union and Wallowa Counties hadn't had a formal Chapter. Because we share the Blue Mountains as our home and wanted to provide opportunity for all woodland owners in our region, we decided to include all four Counties and officially establish the Northeast Oregon Small Woodlands Association (NEOSWA).

Building the Chapter

Since then, we have held several member meetings, created a website (neoswa.com), started a quarterly newsletter, and held our first big event – the NEOSWA Neighbor to Neighbor Tour.

The NEOSWA N2N Tour was held on October 30th and was a huge success, with over 50 folks in attendance, including small woodland owners, neighbors, friends, family, professionals, and policy makers. We had beautiful weather, great speakers, and a fantastic lunch. Thank you to everyone who attended, helped plan and coordinate the event, and an even bigger thank you to the Defrees for being such gracious hosts. We also want to thank the Oregon Forest Resources Institute (OFRI), OSWA, and OSU Extension for sponsoring the event.

Don't Forget to Renew!

As a reminder, don't forget to renew your OSWA membership for 2022. If you are currently an OSWA member, you should have received a renewal notice in the mail this month. If you didn't, or would like to join OSWA, there are two ways to apply for membership:



- 1. Fill out and mail in the Membership Application (attached to this newsletter); or
- 2. Apply online on the OSWA website: https://www.oswa.org/blog/memberships/

As part of the application, you will be asked which Chapter you want to be associated with. The online application may not be updated with the "Northeast Chapter" yet, so select the "Baker/Union Chapter" to join NEOSWA. Once you've joined, we will receive you contact information, and you will begin to receive updates and information from OSWA and NEOSWA (if you don't already).

Funding Programs and Opportunities

As part of a legislative package commonly known as the Farm Bill, there are a number of programs that have funding available for various activities, including conservation and natural resource management. These programs are administered by agencies under the USDA and provide financial and technical assistance to help landowners accomplish their management objectives.

In Northeast Oregon, the Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP), Conservation Implementation Strategy (CIS), Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP), and the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) are the key programs that can help small woodland owners. These programs are administered by the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), with technical assistance provided by the Oregon Department of Forestry (ODF).

Each year, or timeframes, priority areas in the region are identified, and landowners within these areas can apply for funding for specific management activities that meet the programs' criteria. This is a great way to get the financial and technical assistance needed to accomplish things like precommercial thinning, fuels reduction, slash treatment, reforestation, water development, and much more.

To determine current and upcoming priority areas, qualification, and how to apply, contact your local NRCS office or Stewardship Forester in your County.
